Criteria for Information Exchange Exhibits

2. Each entry must include the following information:
 - A. Category (check one):
 - University/community college
 - Extension Service
 - Professional Organization
 - Public Policy Exhibit
 - Classroom teacher
 - Other(specify)

B. Brief Description of Exhibit (Maximum 250 words) including purpose and outcomes.

C. Name of Organization, Exhibitor's Name, Address, Phone, e-mail, fax.

Entry form must be received by January 15, 2011 (postmark or email date). Entries will be evaluated by an annual meeting review committee. Exhibitors whose exhibit is accepted will be notified by February 1, 2011. **Please keep a copy of your submission.**

Each exhibitor will be responsible for bringing his/her material to the exhibit area, setting up at time designated in program (8:15-9:00 AM). Each exhibitor will be provided one table (approximately 53" x 27"). Exhibitors must provide easels and/or any other display materials. Exhibitors needing electrical power must bring a cord.

MAFCS is not responsible for lost, stolen, or removed items.

The exhibitor must be registered for and attend the Annual Meeting and be present during the exhibit time to answer questions about the exhibit in order for the exhibit to be displayed.
